ANNVILLE FREE LIBRARY: WRITING THE NEXT CHAPTER

Many of the alumni of ACS D used and attended programs at the Annv ille Free Library and have wonderful memories of those times past. The community library is a vital institution, constantly changing to remain relevant. Libraries must expand from the traditional services of circulating books, DVDs, magazines, etc. to also include more community spaces dedicated to children, youth and adults for educational programs, activities, club meetings, summer reading programs, and places to access technology. Libraries of the future are not only buildings for books, but also places for people.

With professional assistance from Hickey Architecture, Inc and Arthur Funk & Sons, Inc we have a creative plan for adaptive reuse of the neighboring duplex at 226/228 E Main St plus construction of an addition that will join the duplex and the current library building, also needing renovation. The expanded library will provide space for greater access for all in our community.

Imagine an ADA entrance from the parking lot with automatic opening doors, an entrance from Main St., ADA-compliant family bathrooms, and a new, wide stairway to the lower level children's area. Imagine an enlarged youth area on the main floor, new and spacious community rooms complemented by smaller study and meeting rooms, all anchored by "Lillie's Place" a dedicated area to recognize Lille Struble's contribution to our community library. Outside, imagine a patio and sun shade with outdoor seating next to the rear entrance and rain garden, and inside, you'll still find the welcoming, comfortable atmosphere of our original fireplace rooms.
