The Annville-Cleona Alumni Association is in trouble!

The ACAA was organized many years ago and membership was open to only those who attended & graduated from the Greystone Building – currently the Annville Elementary School. Realizing that would cause the organization to go extinct, and we would like to see it continue, therefore, a few years ago it was decided to open the membership to all those who attended the Annville-Cleona School District schools.

We exist for numerous reasons – among those are: 1) maintaining a comprehensive listing of all those people who attended the Annville Schools (a monumental task in the works). We build the database from class listings supplied to us from each keeper of class records, and can keep the listing up-to-date through our mailing of the quarterly newsletter; 2) providing a \$1000.00 scholarship to a deserving graduating senior; 3) recognizing an outstanding alumnus or alumna of the year, who has engaged in community and organizational service; 4) publishing a quarterly newsletter, *The Dutchmen Chronicle*.; 5) hosting an annual dinner in the Spring (see included reservation form) that provides attendees the opportunity to socialize with their own classmates and others; and, 6) manning a booth at Historic Old Annville Day (HOAD) where we distribute information and encourage new members to sign on.

Since we are maintaining a database of all ACSD attendees and keeping it updated on a quarterly basis we are able to provide updated mailing lists for class reunions. ANNVILLE FREE LIBRARY: WRITING THE NEXT CHAPTER

It is now a year since we started writing update articles for the *Dutchmen Chronicle* about the expansion project for the AFL. We are pleased to report continued progress towards our expected groundbreaking early this summer. The Land Development Plan is now on file with the County along with our Stormwater Management Operations & Maintenance Agreement and Declaration of Easement, wow what a title. Annville Township has received our required escrow payment and we appreciate and thank Nick Yingst, the Township Administrator, for shepherding us through the numerous steps to get to this point.

Hickey Architects and Arthur Funk & Sons are busy finalizing the construction diagrams, currently at 73 pages and more to do.

These diagrams describe in great detail what and how we want the project built. Next is the bid document, followed by contractor selection and contract signing, then permitting and project start. During this prep work we anxiously await the results of our \$750,000 Keystone Grant application from the PA Department of Education. By late March we should find out and will let everyone know the results.

To save money and get started volunteers have started demo work inside the 226/228 E Main St duplex. This space will be a new community room after extensive work to meet structural code requirements. We have not thrown much away and kitchen cabinets, 5 panel doors, washer and dryer, refrigerator, water softener, boiler, pedestal sink, wall boards, coal bin boards, stair railings, balusters and newel posts, trim boards, and even bundles of lathe were sold on Facebook MarketPlace. We are happy these items found new homes all over central PA and added money to our project funds.
